# Three alumni are new Phi Delta members

r. Erlinda Vasquez, Dr. Arturo Pasa, and Dr. Editha Cagasan are welcomed as new members of the Phi Delta Honor Society of Science on February 9, 2009. They presented their contribution to science in the inaugural lecture held at the AV-Room of the Farm and Resource Management Institute, Visayas State University.

Dr. Erlinda Vasquez (BSA '80) presented her research on "Pheromones of Sweetpotato Weevils: Fornicarius fabr., *Cylas brunneus* Oliver and *Cylas punicollis* Boheman." Her research highlighted on the use of pheromones to control insect population.

One the other hand, Dr. Arturo Pasa (BSF '92) discussed his study on "Rewarding Environmental Sciences Providers (ESP): Lessons from Midwestern Leyte." This study that he conducted in Barangay Gabas and Kilim in Baybay, determined the rural smallholders' perspectives on the various forest ecosystems services, the types of rewards anticipated to compensate the effort of ESP, the providers of rewards and preferred payment mechanisms.

Dr. Editha Cagasan talked about her research on "Assessment of the Land Administration Management Project Phase 1 (LAMP-1) Using the Story Approach." She used a new monitoring and evaluation technique known as the Story Approach to profile and capture the range of changes experienced by the beneficiaries of the LAMP-1 interventions in several municipalities in Leyte.

# ALUMNI CONVERSATIONS ...

Dr. Suzette Lina, BSA '98

r. Suzette Lina (BSA '98) is accorded the Special Excellence Award by the Tokyo University of Agriculture and Technology on March 25, 2009. A Monbukagakusho scholar from 2006-2009, she finished her PhD in Agriculture (Soil Science) at TUAT Tokyo, Japan.

## What brought you to TUAT-JP?

It's my interest in pursuing a PhD in a country with advanced technology. I was introduced by Dr. Algerico Mariscal to Dr. Masanori Okazaki (TUAT-Professor) in 2002 at VSU where we discussed research in Soil Science and sago palm.

# What professional and personal challenges did you face initially after taking your PhD?

I'm anxious about culture differences and language. At first, I thought taking a PhD was a very big challenge and responsibility. Indeed, it was true, especially that I took it in Japan where culture plays an important role. I have to be sensitive enough not to disrespect their opinion and yet able to express what I want.

# Did you always target this career? Whether you have or not, is the role fulfilling?

Yes, it's really my goal to get a PhD degree in Soil Science. Having it is not easy but the role is fulfilling.

#### What advice can you give to students taking up Soil Science?

For students who have the desire in pursuing graduate studies in Soil Science, it should come from your heart. If you love your field, no matter how difficult the challenges are, you will be able to overcome them. There are many opportunities in Agriculture (Soil Science) and I believed that this is one of the ever important fields, not only in the Philippines, but in other countries as well.

From your experience, what could students do to supplement their education in VSU to make them even more competitive and marketable?



Just keep on doing and don't just be contented. Make use all of the possible resources around to make you equipped and competitive. Set your own goal and keep hitting on it for obstacles may come easily when you take your eyes off it. Lastly, hard work and determination are important ingredients of success in any field.
